

**2009 MASTER OF MEDICINE (EMERGENCY MEDICINE)/ MEMBERSHIP OF COLLEGE OF  
EMERGENCY MEDICINE (MCEM) PART B & PART C EXAMINATIONS**

**PART B EXAM DATE: 19 AUGUST 2009**

**PART C EXAM DATE: 22 – 23 AUGUST 2009**

Announced on 13 May 09

**ELIGIBILITY**

Applicants must meet the following to be eligible to apply for the abovementioned examination to be held in Singapore:

1. Candidates must hold a primary medical qualification that is acceptable to the United Kingdom General Medical Council for Full Registration or with an appropriate authority. This must be valid at the time of the examination, although we will accept applications where the registration is due to be renewed, providing we receive a new confirmation before the actual examination.
2. Applicants must have completed at least 1 year as interns or House Officers. In addition they must have **at least 20 months of post full registration experience** as Medical Officers (MO)/ Senior House Officers (SHO) consisting of the following postings:
  - a) At least **8 months** of Emergency Medicine postings; and
  - b) At least **12 months** of a programme of posts relevant to the practice of Emergency Medicine. Suggested relevant posts include the following: acute medicine, anaesthesia, intensive care medicine, paediatrics, orthopaedics, and related disciplines. No more than six months of any one of these specialties will be counted as contributing to suitable relevant experience.
3. A pass in any one of the following examinations:
  - a) MCEM Part A
  - b) Part 1 MRCP or Part 1 MRCP Ireland
  - c) Part 1 MRCPCH
  - d) Parts 1 & 2 FRCA (prior to August 1996)
  - e) The MCQ component of the MRCS of any of the Royal Surgical Colleges of Great Britain and Ireland
  - f) Parts 1 & 2 of the Intercollegiate MRCS
4. Applicants can apply to sit for the examinations if they fulfil the above requirements. However candidates would only be conferred the Master of Medicine (Emergency Medicine) (M.Med (EM)) degree after they have fully completed the following:
  - a) at least 1 year of Emergency Medicine postings;
  - b) at least 1 year of Medical postings (of which preferably 6 months should be in General Medicine and up to 6 months in other medical related postings such as cardiology, geriatric medicine, neurology, oncology, paediatrics, and related disciplines); and
  - c) at least 1 year of Surgical postings (of which preferably 6 months should be in General Surgery and up to 6 months in other surgical related postings such as orthopaedics, neurosurgery, ophthalmology, anaesthesia, burns, colorectal surgery, ENT, and related disciplines).

5. Re-sit candidates who need to take either the M.Med (EM)/ MCEM Part B or M.Med (EM)/ MCEM Part C may take the examinations in Singapore. However, the M.Med (EM) degree would only be conferred to applicants who had attempted and passed both Part B and Part C in Singapore.
6. We do not offer MCEM as a standalone examination in Singapore.

## **APPLICATION**

**CLOSING DATE: Friday, 19 June 2009**

Both the M.Med and MCEM application forms can be downloaded from [www.med.nus.edu.sg/dgms](http://www.med.nus.edu.sg/dgms) or obtained from the DGMS office.

**Note:** All applications / fees must reach DGMS by the closing date. Late or incomplete applications will not be entertained and will be returned to sender. Applications received through fax will not be accepted.

The following documents must be enclosed with the application:

1. 2 passport sized photos
2. 2 separate cheque/ bank draft for the respective exam fees payable to NUS and CEM
3. 1 set of M.Med application form plus 1 set of the relevant MCEM application forms
4. A certified true copy of your medical registration document issued by the appropriate authority
5. A copy of your MCEM Part A or any other acceptable examination result

## **METHOD OF PAYMENT**

For candidates who are taking the M.Med (EM)/ MCEM Parts B & C, please submit 1 cheque/ bank draft of **S\$2,740** (inclusive of S\$53.50 exam registration fee and S\$40 non-refundable application fee) made payable to **"National University of Singapore"** and 1 bank draft of **£550** made payable to **"The College of Emergency Medicine"**.

For candidates who are re-sitting the Part B exam, please submit 1 cheque/ bank draft of **S\$590** (inclusive of S\$40.00 non-refundable application fee) made payable to **"National University of Singapore"** and 1 bank draft of **£250** made payable to **"The College of Emergency Medicine"**.

For candidates who are re-sitting the Part C exam, please submit 1 cheque/ bank draft of **S\$2,190** (inclusive of S\$40.00 non-refundable application fee) made payable to **"National University of Singapore"** and 1 bank draft of **£300** made payable to **"The College of Emergency Medicine"**.

## **WITHDRAWAL FROM EXAMINATION**

For withdrawals, the respective NUS and CEM withdrawal guidelines would apply.

Notice of withdrawal from the examination(s) must be given in writing to DGMS. For the M.Med fees, the entire fee, *less* S\$53.50 registration fee would be refunded when notice of withdrawal is received before the closing date. Those who withdraw after this date or who are absent from the examination will not receive any refund of the examination fees.
