**2009 MEMBERSHIP EXAMINATION OF THE
COLLEGE OF EMERGENCY MEDICINE (MCEM)/ MASTER OF MEDICINE
(M.MED) EMERGENCY MEDICINE EXAMINATION
PART A (MCQ)
(SINGAPORE CENTRE)
9 June 2009 (Closing date: 3 April 2009)
10 December 2009 (Closing date: 16 October 2009)**

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must hold a primary medical qualification that is acceptable to the United Kingdom General Medical Council for Full or Limited Registration or to the Medical Council in Ireland for Full or Temporary Registration in order to be eligible for the Membership Examination of the College of Emergency Medicine. Part A cannot be taken sooner than the second foundation year of training or its overseas equivalent. Thus the candidate must have completed at least one year of experience post qualification and therefore be Fully registered with the GMC (or equivalent) (please visit the college website for the full exam entry requirement at <http://www.mcem.org.uk/examsparta>). For local candidates, they would be eligible to apply for the exam once they are in their first post-houseman year (ie. upon becoming a Medical Officer)

EXAM FORMAT

Part A consists of a knowledge test in Multiple Choice format with 50 questions each with four stems. It is not negatively marked. It examines basic sciences as applied to Emergency Medicine. The syllabus for the Part A can be found on the college website at <http://www.mcem.org.uk/examsparta>

APPLICATION

The M.Med (EM) and MCEM Part A application forms can be downloaded from DGMS website at <http://medicine.nus.edu.sg/dgms/> or the college website at <http://www.mcem.org.uk/examapplications>.

All applications / fees must reach DGMS by the closing date. Late or incomplete applications will not be entertained and will be returned to sender. Applications received through fax will not be accepted.

The following documents must be enclosed with the application:

1. 1 passport sized photo
2. 2 separate cheque/ bank draft for the respective exam fees payable to NUS and CEM
3. MCEM and M.Med (EM) Part A Application forms
4. A certified true copy of your medical registration issued by the appropriate body
5. A certified true copy of your medical qualification (MBBS)

METHOD OF PAYMENT

Applicants are to submit 1 cheque/ bank draft of **S\$540** (inclusive of S\$40 non-refundable application fee) made payable to "**National University of Singapore**" and 1 bank draft of **£250** made payable to "**The College of Emergency Medicine**".
