<p><u>Primary</u></p> <p>- may be taken at any point in training)</p>	<p>a) MCQ Examination in Ophthalmic Basic Sciences b) MCQ Examination Optics and Refraction</p> <p><i>(FRCSEd Part 1 and 2 or the FRCOphth Part 1 or an equivalent as fulfilling the requirements of the MCQ component.)</i></p> <p>c) Practical Refraction Assessment</p> <p>30-minute, patient based assessment of objective and subjective refraction and related skills such as muscle balance, understanding of optometric and orthoptic devices</p> <p><i>(FRCSEd Part 3, Refraction certificate of the Royal College of Ophthalmologists or equivalent accepted as fulfilling this requirement)</i></p>
<p><u>Final</u></p> <p>- 30 months of training in Ophthalmology required</p> <p>- Primary MMed or equivalent must be passed in order to enter Final MMed</p>	<p>a) Oral Examinations</p> <p>Three stations of 20 minute each in:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. Clinical Ophthalmology ii. Ophthalmic Surgery and Pathology iii. Ophthalmology in relation to Medicine and Neurology <p>b) Clinical Examination</p> <p>Three stations of 20 minutes each in:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. Anterior Segment ii. Posterior Segment and Ophthalmology in relation to General Medicine iii. Neuro-ophthalmology, Oculoplastics, Paediatric Ophthalmology and Ocular Motility
